He has earned the Certified-Professional Aerial Applicator Safety Steward (C-PAASS) designation.

In his personal life, Rivenbark and Tiffany have a seven-year-old daughter, Anna Keith. He belongs to the Kiwanis' chapter in Clinton and their family belongs to the First Methodist Church of Clinton.

Reflecting on the evolving nature of the aerial application industry, Rivenbark noted, "Things change. To survive, one must embrace change. Whether it be a crop-dusting business or a big corporation, if you don't embrace change you are obsolete. We've gone from doing most of our shopping at malls to now Amazon delivering all our goods. Change happens, you have to embrace it instead of fight it."
